River Terrace Medallions

The Charles Bergen Studios led team – Mara Cherkasky (Historian), Brandon Bailey (Artist), and Chris Earley (Civil Engineer) – has been commissioned by the DC Public Schools for the 590 foot long Perimeter Fence Artwork for the River Terrace Special Education Center in the River Terrace Neighborhood of Washington, DC. Located along the Anacostia River the artwork consists of a series of 30-inch diameter painted steel medallions connected with intertwined four-inch metal "waves." The medallions tell the history of the River Terrace Community from 10,000 years ago to the present. The waves represent water, the Anacostia River and the passage of time.


